CORE Clinic Series Overview

The Interscholastic Equestrian Association (IEA) has joined in partnership with the United States Hunter Jumper Association (USHJA) to create a new clinic series that will offer enhanced opportunities to educate students in grades 6-12 about horsemanship and riding in a draw-based (catch-ride) format.

Head Clinician: Candice King

Candice King is a world class Grand Prix show jumper who has garnered multiple FEI titles and awards over the past 2 decades. She has represented the USA on multiple Nations Cup teams and was also the top ranked US rider at the 2001 World Cup Final in Gothenburg, Sweden. Since winning the coveted 2001 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at the CSIO5* Hickstead in England, Candice has continued to rack up top placing Grand Prix finishes nationally and internationally. She was shortlisted for the 2006 World Equestrian Games, was a member of the 2nd place U.S. team at the 2013 Furusiyya FEI Nations Cup at the CSIO5* Spruce Meadows and was a member of two winning FEI Nations Cup teams in 2015.

Clinic Format

The clinic is limited to 24 riders. HALF (1/2) of the riding spots for the clinic will be allocated to USHJA active members (and/or Intercollegiate members) and the other HALF (1/2) of the riding spots will be allocated to USHJA Scholastic Members (members of IEA and USHJA) who compete in the IEA at the Intermediate or Open level. Auditing the riding session will be free to the public.

Horses are available to lease from The Jaeckle Centre or riders may choose to bring their own. (Limited number of horses are available for lease.) Riders bringing their own horses must have the understanding that the format of the clinic will be of a catch-ride nature. Other participants may potentially ride participating horses under the guidance and supervision of the head clinician.

Two Day Clinic Format

- Four (4) groups with Four to Six (4-6) riding participants per group
- Four (4) Rotating Sessions
 - Riding
 - Audit/Assist in ring with Head Clinician
 - Classroom
 - Barn & Stable Management

Entry Fee: \$450
Horse Lease Fee: \$150 for weekend
Stabling Fee for own horse: \$100 for weekend (includes 1 bag of shavings). Additional shavings can be purchased for \$8 per bag. Hay is available for purchase at \$11 per bale.

Lunch will be provided for all clinic participants. Additional lunches can be purchased for auditors-must be indicated in advance on clinic registration form.
